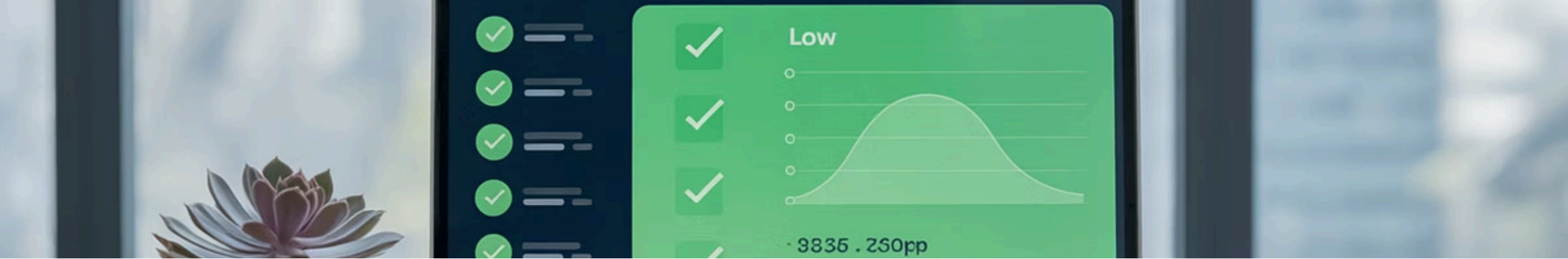
Flow Assessment

Integration of academic sources, application of theoretical frameworks, and demonstration of scholarly engagement.



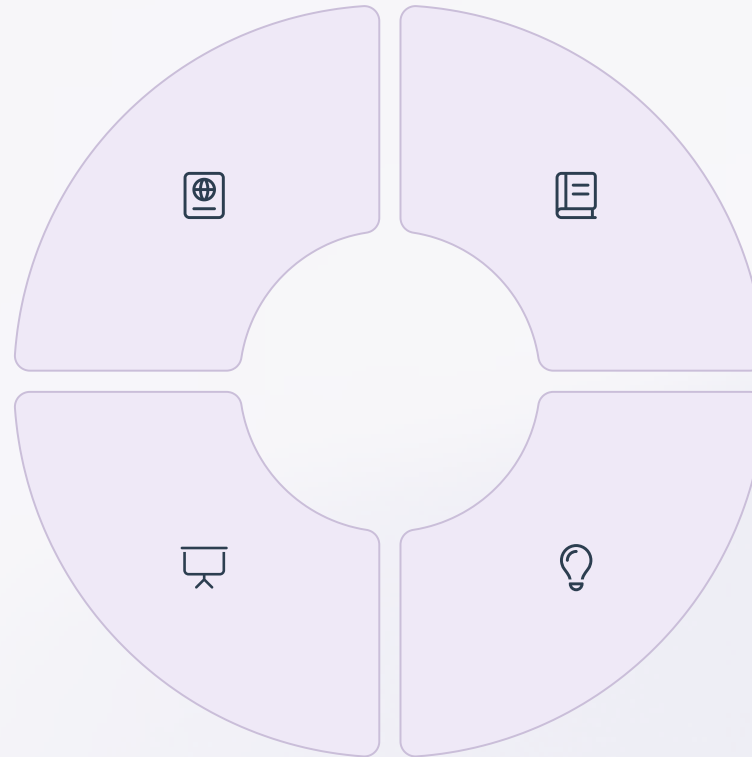
Presentation & Writing
